- B. The following text <u>amends</u> (in Ramseyer format) the response to question #4 in Questions & Answers on HIePRO.
 - Q: Will the implementation provider be required to float rebate payments, i.e. will the implementation provider be required to pay out rebates to recipients with their own money then await reimbursement from the state? If so, how often can this reimbursement be invoiced to the state and what is the maximum time for these invoices to be paid?
 - A: Section 2.6 of the RFP outlines federal requirements of the contract, including compliance with 2 CFR Part 200. The Offeror should ensure their proposed rebate payment process complies with 2 CFR 200.305 concerning Federal payment. [HSEO anticipates that the rebate payment will be paid from a federal payor directly to the contractor making a valid rebate claim and will not need to go through HSEO or implementation provider. If an Offeror proposes an alternative to this,] HSEO may only be invoiced once monthly at net 30 payment terms.
- C. The following text <u>amends</u> (in Ramseyer format) the response to question #7 in Questions & Answers on HIePRO.
 - Q: Section 4.4 states that work under this contract is taxable under Hawai'i GET for sales made on O'ahu. Does this include rebates paid to recipients under the contract, i.e. if \$54,000,000 in rebates are paid out, is the implementation provider responsible for paying .04*54,000,000=\$2,700,000 in GET tax on that amount?
 - A: [HSEO anticipates that the rebate payment will be paid from a federal payor directly to the contractor making a valid rebate claim and will not need to go through HSEO or implementation provider.] If an Offeror proposes to process and pay rebate payments themselves [an alternative to this], HSEO will consult with the Hawai'i Department of Taxation to determine if GET applies.
- D. The following text <u>amends</u> (in Ramseyer format) the response to question #43 in Questions & Answers on HIePRO.
 - Q: Rebate Disbursements:
 - a. Please clarify how rebate funding will be processed once approved. Will HSEO be distributing the rebate funding directly or will the contractor be responsible for issuing disbursements?
 - b. If the contractor will be responsible for issuing disbursements, will HSEO be providing the funding to the contractor prior to disbursement?
 - A: <u>Section 2.6 of the RFP outlines federal requirements of the contract, including compliance with 2 CFR Part 200. The Offeror should ensure their proposed rebate payment process complies with 2 CFR 200.305 concerning Federal payment. [Given program</u>

requirements established by U.S. DOE, rebates will be made directly from a federal payor and will not need to go through HSEO. Further, valid rebate claims can only be made for work by a certified contractor. As such, HSEO anticipates that the rebate will be paid directly to the contractor making a valid rebate claim.]
