SPECIFICATIONS

SCOPE OF WORK

The CAMHD seeks to commence a suicide prevention campaign in the month of September with the goals of spreading awareness of reputable interventions, promoting opportunities for community connection, and reducing stigma related to experiencing serious mental illness and suicidal ideation.

Work shall consist of scheduling, placement, and reporting of existing photo and video advertisement assets across digital channels, including but not limited to, streaming television, targeted display and video, and social media advertisements.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

- A. The CONTRACTOR shall collaborate and regularly communicate with the CAMHD via videoconferencing, emails, and/or telephone calls during the development, production, and distribution phases to provide status updates, ensure incorporation of the CAMHD's priorities, and seek feedback from the CAMHD in its suicide prevention campaign, including, but not limited to, the following:
 - 1. Demonstrate project viability with a work-in-progress snapshot, including, but not limited to, still images, advertisement mock-ups, or sample video.
 - 2. Create an anticipated development, production, and distribution timeline that includes potential problems or concerns that may develop prior to completion of the work, and proposed methods to address them.
 - 3. Only broadcast and distribute the advertising materials approved by the CAMHD.
- B. The CONTRACTOR shall program messages tailored to the following audiences within the STATE:
 - 1. Youth ages 18 years and younger.
 - 2. Youth experiencing or at risk of experiencing serious emotional disturbances.
- C. The CONTRACTOR shall program digital advertisements on channels, including, but not limited to, streaming television, targeted display and video, and social media.
 - 1. The advertisements shall run from September 20, 2024, to September 30, 2024.
 - 2. The advertisements shall result in no less than 3,750,000 impressions within the target audience.
 - 3. Advertisements shall be connected to the CAMHD's Pixel ID and Google Analytics accounts wherever possible.
 - 4. Social media advertisements shall be run on the following accounts:

 - b) Instagram @hawaiicares988
 - c) YouTube @camhdhawaii
 - d) YouTube @hawaiicares988
- D. The CONTRACTOR shall submit performance reports no later than thirty (30) days after the end of the Campaign run date. The report shall include information on ad creatives, placements, reach, frequency, impressions, cost per impression, engagement, cost per engagement, link clicks, cost per link click, and click-through-rate wherever possible.

E.	The CONTRACTOR shall provide the STATE with copies of all material and content produced as a product of the Campaign in a timely manner. The STATE shall own any material and content produced.

TERM OF CONTRACT

The CONTRACTOR shall be provided a Purchase Order for a media campaign for a period

commencing on September 20, 2024 and ending on September 30, 2024.

FUNDING

Funding is subject to appropriation, budget execution policies, availability of funding, and the needs of the CAMHD. The CAMHD reserves the right to increase reimbursement rates as it deems fit if and when additional funding becomes available. **The amount of funding will not exceed seventy five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00.)**

BIDDER QUALIFICATION

- Bidder shall have a minimum of three (3) consecutive years of experience in message development, multimedia production, scheduling, placement, and reporting of multimedia campaigns across the State. Proof of experience shall be required.
- 2. Bidder shall have at the time of bidding, a compliant Certificate of Vendor Compliance ("CVC") from Hawaii Compliance Express ("HCE") or the equivalent certificates from the various STATE agencies listed on page SC-10. In addition to meeting the legal and other requirements to this IFB, bidder must meet these bidder qualifications requirements to be considered for award.
- 3. Bidder shall be HCE compliant or provide the equivalent certificates within fourteen (14) days of the release of the Intent to award.

RESPONSIBILITY OF OFFERORS

Offeror is advised that if awarded a Contract under this solicitation, Offeror shall, upon award of the Contract, furnish proof of compliance with the requirements of §103D-310(c), HRS:

- 2. Unless otherwise required by law, the cost which have been quoted in this IFB have not been knowingly disclosed by the bidder prior to award, directly or indirectly, to any other bidder or competitor prior to the award of the Contract.
- No other attempt has been made or shall be made by the bidder to indicate any other person or firm to submit or not to submit for the purpose of restricting competition.

The STATE's responses shall not be construed to make any changes to the IFB unless otherwise revised by an addendum to the IFB.

BID PREPARATION

Offer Form, Page OF-1 & OF-2. Offeror is required to submit Page OF-1 and OF-2 with its HIePRO offer using Offeror's exact legal name as registered with the STATE's Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("DCCA") and as shown in HCE, if applicable; and to indicate exact legal name in the appropriate space on Offer Form, page OF-1. Failure to do so may delay proper execution of the Contract.

<u>Bid Quotation</u>. Bid price shall be all inclusive, and include, but not limited to, all applicable taxes and expenses incurred to provide services specified herein. **Note the bids must be made in HIPRO**.

<u>Tax Liability</u>. Work to be performed under this solicitation is a business activity taxable under Chapter 237, HRS, and vendors are advised that they are liable for the STATE's General Excise Tax ("GET") at the current rate for each county. If, however, an Offeror is a person exempt by the HRS from paying the GET and therefore not liable for the taxes on this solicitation, Offeror shall state its tax-exempt status and cite the HRS chapter or section allowing the exemption.

<u>Taxpayer Preference</u>. For evaluation purposes, pursuant to §103D-1008, HRS, the Offeror's taxexempt price offer submitted in response to an IFB shall be increased by the applicable retail rate of GET and the applicable use tax. Under no circumstance shall the dollar amount of the award include the aforementioned adjustment.

<u>Insurance.</u> Bidder shall provide insurance information as requested on the appropriate Offer Form page. Further, awardee shall provide insurance coverage for contents in accordance with the attached Specifications.

<u>References</u>. Bidder shall list as references companies for whom bidder has provided or is currently providing on a regular basis services similar in nature and in volume to services

specified herein. The STATE reserves the right to contact the references to inquire about bidders past performance.

Confidential Information.

Offerors shall designate those portions of their offer that contain trade secrets or other proprietary data that are to remain confidential subject to Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR") §§ 3-122-21(a)(7) and 3-122-30 (c) and (d). Material designated as confidential shall be readily separable from the offer in order to facilitate public inspection of the non-confidential portion of the offer. Prices, makes and models, or catalogue number of items offered, deliveries and terms of payment, shall be publicly available at the time of opening regardless of any designation to the contrary.

SUBMISSION OF OFFER

Offers shall be received through the HIePRO system no later than the date and time stated on the cover page of the IFB and as stated in HIePRO. Timely receipt of offers shall be evidenced by the date and time registered by the HIePRO system. Supporting detail that is physically unable to be transmitted electronically shall be identified in the HIePRO offer and with the approval of the Issuing Officer may be delivered and must be received at the above address within ten (10) calendar days by 3:30 pm HST of the Offer deadline.

AWARD OF CONTRACT

<u>Method of Award.</u> Award, if made, shall be to the responsive, responsible Offeror submitting the lowest offer.

Responsibility of Lowest Responsive Bidder. Reference §103D-310(c), HRS. If compliance documents have not been submitted to the Issuing Officer prior to award, the lowest responsive and responsible offeror shall produce documents within fourteen (14) days of the receipt of the Intent to Award notice to the Issuing Officer to demonstrate compliance

with this section. Failure to provide the compliance documents as required shall result

in the Offeror being deemed non- responsive.

HCE. Instead of separately applying for these certificates at the various STATE agencies as shown

The <u>application</u> for the clearance is the responsibility of the Offeror and must be submitted directly to the DOTAX or IRS and not to the Issuing Officer. However, the tax clearance certificate shall be submitted to the Issuing Officer.

HRS Chapters 383 (Unemployment Insurance), 386 (Workers' Compensation), 392 (Temporary Disability Insurance), and 393 (Prepaid Health Care) requirements for award.

Instructions are as follows:

Pursuant to §103D-310(c), HRS, the lowest responsive Offeror shall be required to submit a certificate of compliance issued by the STATE's Department of Labor and Industrial Relations ("DLIR"). Compliance with Section 103D-310(c), HRS, for an entity doing business in the STATE. In addition to the HCE compliance or tax clearance certificate, an original "Certification of Compliance for Final Payment" (SPO Form-22), attached, shall be required for final payment. ACCEPTANCE OF OFFER

Acceptance of Offeror, if any, shall be made within sixty (60) calendar days after the opening of Offerors, and the prices quoted by the Offeror shall remain firm for a sixty (60) days period or a longer period as may be allowed upon mutual agreement of the parties.

CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS BY STATE AND COUNTY CONTRACTORS

It has been determined that funds for this Contract will be funded by a federal grant.

Therefore, Offeror, if awarded a Contract in response to this solicitation, agrees to comply with Section 11-205.5, HRS, which states that campaign contributions are prohibited from a STATE and county government CONTRACTOR during the term of the Contract if the CONTRACTOR is paid with funds appropriated by a legislative body.

PURCHASE ORDER EXECUTION

The STATE shall forward a formal Purchase Order approval to the successful Offeror for

execution. NO PERFORMANCE OR PAYMENT BONDS ARE REQUIRED FOR THIS

CONTRACT.

Work shall commence on the official commencement date specified in the Purchase Order.

No work is to be undertaken by the CONTRACTOR prior to the official commencement date in

the Purchase Order. The STATE is not liable for any work, contract, costs, expenses, loss of

profits, or any damage whatsoever incurred by the CONTRACTOR prior to the work start date.

GENERAL LIABILITY/AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE

The CONTRACTOR shall maintain in full force and effect during the life of this Contract, liability

and property damage insurance to protect the CONTRACTOR and its subcontractors, if any, from

claims for damages for personal injury, accidental death and property damage which may arise

from operations under this Contract, whether such operations be by itself or by an subcontractor or

anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them. If any subcontractor is involved in the

performance of the Contract, the insurance policy or policies shall name the subcontractor as

additional insured.

As an alternative to the CONTRACTOR providing insurance to cover operations performed by a

subcontractor and naming the subcontractor as additional insured, **CONTRACTOR** may require

Each insurance policy required by the Contract, including a subcontractor's policy, shall contain the following clauses:

1. "The State of Hawaii and its officers and employees are additional insured with respect to operations performed for the State of Hawaii."

3. "It is agreed that any insurance maintained by the STATE shall apply in excess of, and not contribute with, insurance provided by this policy."

The minimum insurance required shall be in full compliance with the Hawaii Insurance Code throughout the entire term of the Contract, including supplemental agreements.

Upon CONTRACTOR's execution of the Contract, the CONTRACTOR agrees to deposit with the STATE a Certificate of Insurance ("COI") necessary to satisfy the STATE that the insurance provisions of this Contract have been complied with and to keep such insurance in effect and the certificate(s) therefore on deposit with the STATE during the entire term of the Contract, including those of its subcontractor(s), where appropriate. Upon request by the STATE, CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for furnishing a copy of the policy or policies.

Failure of the CONTRACTOR to provide and keep in force such insurance shall be regarded as material default under the Contract, entitling the STATE to exercise any or all of the remedies provided in this Contract for a default of the CONTRACTOR.

The procuring of such required insurance shall not be construed to limit CONTRACTOR's liability hereunder nor to fulfill the indemnification provisions and requirements of the Contract. Notwithstanding said policy or policies of insurance, CONTRACTOR shall be obliged for the full and total amount of any damage, injury, or loss caused by negligence or neglect connected with the Contract.

SUBCONTRACTORS

The CONTRACTOR shall not delegate any duties listed in this IFB to any subcontractor, unless the Contract Administrator has given prior written approval.

INSPECTION

The STATE retains the general right of inspection by a designated representative in order to judge, whether in the STATE's opinion, such work is being performed by the CONTRACTOR in accordance with terms of this bid proposal.

INVOICING

Invoices shall be payable upon certification by the Contract Administrator that the CONTRACTOR has satisfactorily performed the required services.

CONTRACTOR shall submit original and two (2) copies of the invoice for the Contract to the following address:

Invoice shall reference the ASO LOG NO. as shown on the Contract.

A current CVC issued through the HCE system, shall be acceptable for final payment requirements.

Alternately, a tax clearance certificate, not over two (2) months old, with an original green certified copy stamp, must accompany the invoice for final payment on the contract. In addition to the tax clearance certificate, an original "Certification of Compliance for Final Payment" (SPO Form-22), attached, shall be required for final payment. A copy of the form is also available at www.spo.hawaii.gov. Select "Forms for Vendors/Contractors" from the Quicklinks.

PAYMENT

Section 103-10, HRS, provides that the STATE shall have thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of invoice or satisfactory completion of contract to make payment. For this reason, the STATE shall reject any bid submitted with a condition requiring payment within a shorter period. Further, the STATE shall reject any bid submitted with a condition requiring interest payments greater than that allowed by §103-10, HRS, as amended.

The STATE shall not recognize any requirement established by the CONTRACTOR and communicated to the STATE after award of the Contract, which requires payment within a shorter period or interest payment not in conformance with the HRS.

Original monthly claims must be submitted within thirty (30) calendar days after the last day of each calendar month. All submissions and corrections must be properly received by the CAMHD no later than ninety (90) days after the last day of the billing month.

Should the CONTRACTOR need to bill beyond the ninety (90) days, documented contact must be made with the CAMHD Provider Relations before the end of the ninety (90) days. However, no payment shall be made for claims submitted more than twelve (12) months after the last day on which services were rendered or more than six (6) months following the end of the Contract period, whichever period is shorter.

REMOVAL OF CONTRACTOR'S EMPLOYEES

CONTRACTOR agrees to remove any of its employees from services rendered and to be rendered to the STATE, upon request in writing by the Procurement Officer.

RIGHTS AND REMEDIES FOR DEFAULT

In the event the CONTRACTOR fails, refuses, or neglects to perform the services in accordance with the requirements of these Special Conditions, the Specifications, the General Provisions for Goods and Services HRS Chapter 103D, and General Conditions herein, in addition to any other recourse allowed by law, the STATE reserves the right to purchase in the open market, a corresponding quantity of the services specified herein and to deduct from any moneys due or that may thereafter become due the CONTRACTOR, the difference between the price named in the Contract and the actual cost thereof to the STATE. In case any money due the

CONTRACTOR is insufficient for said purpose, the CONTRACTOR shall pay the difference upon demand by the STATE. The STATE may also utilize all other remedies provided by law.

PROTEST

A protest shall be submitted in writing within five (5) working days after the posting of the award as listed below; provided that a protest based upon the content of the solicitation shall be submitted in writing prior to the date set for receipt of offers.
