2. NOTICE TO BIDDERS

Invitation For Bids No. IFB-27-HHL-004, Chain Link Fence Installation at the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) South Kohala Distribution Road Property, Island of Hawaii, will be issued and awarded through the State Procurement Office's electronic procurement system (HiePRO).

This project is subject to Section 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and to the payment of not less than the prevailing wages promulgated by the State of Hawaii, Department of Industrial Relations.

Bid Offers for IFB-27-HHL-004 must be submitted electronically via HiePRO no later than 2:00 p.m., Hawaii Standard Time (H.S.T), October 9, 2026. The Bid Offer Form (OF-1) must be uploaded to HiePRO as an attachment. Bids received after the due date and time or received other than electronically via HiePRO will not be considered.

A written NOTICE OF INTENTION TO BID is required and shall be received by the DHHL, Land Management Division, at 91-5420 Kapolei Parkway, Kapolei, Hawaii 96707, no later than 2:00 pm, H.S.T, on September 28, 2026. Submittal of a NOTICE OF INTENTION TO BID via e-mail to ashley.n.tabalno@hawaii.gov is acceptable.

A surety bid bond will be required for this Invitation for Bids.

Bidders are solely responsible for ensuring that their electronic submission through HiePRO is complete and all required information is submitted with the bid before the Invitation for Bids (IFB) due date and time. DHHL will not be responsible for any delays or failures of any Bidder to submit all requested information.

REQUIREMENT OF PERFORMANCE AND PAYMENT BONDS

Performance bond and Payment Bond shall be required for contracts of \$50,000 (fifty thousand dollars) and higher. At the time of the execution of the contract, the successful Bidder shall file good and sufficient performance bond and payment bond on the form furnished by DHHL, **each** in an amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the amount of the contract price unless otherwise stated in the solicitation of bids. Bidders may use their own form, which complies with similar content in DHHL's bond forms.

If the Contractor fails to deliver the required performance and payment bonds, the Contractor's award shall be canceled; DHHL shall have the remedies provided below under Section III., I, FAILURE TO EXECUTE THE CONTRACT and award of the contract shall be made to the next lowest responsible and responsive Bidder.

3. SPECIFICATIONS

This section indicates the Specifications for chain link fence and gate installation required by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) at the South Kohala Distribution Road property and three nearby burial site lots located near South Kohala Distribution Road, Kamuela, Hawaii 96743. The Specifications listed are the minimum requirements and are mandatory for an accepted bid.

3.1 Scope of Work:

The Contractor shall provide all labor, materials, equipment, transportation, and supervision necessary to furnish and install chain link fencing and gates as described below. All work shall comply with these Specifications, the Standard Details for chain link fences and gates (Attachment B), and applicable codes and standards.

3.1.A Chain Link Fence Installation- South Kohala Distribution Road Section A

1. Install approximately 530 linear feet of 6-foot chain link fence along South Kohala Distribution Road in Section A.
2. Utilize existing dust fence posts where available; where not available, install new line posts.
3. Line posts shall be spaced a maximum of 10 feet apart and driven or set in concrete to a minimum depth consistent with Section 32 31 13 – Chain Link Fences and Gates.
4. Project area is asphalt-covered; drilling will be required for most post installations.

3.1.B Chain Link Fence Installation – South Kohala Distribution Road Section B

1. Install approximately 620 linear feet of 6-foot chain link fence along South Kohala Distribution Road in Section B utilizing existing dust fence posts.
2. Where existing posts are not adequate, install new line posts in accordance with these Specifications and Attachment B.
3. Cost for replacement posts shall be included in the unit price.

3.1.C Chain Link Fence Installation – South Kohala Distribution Road Section C

1. Install approximately 170 linear feet of 6-foot chain link fence along South Kohala Distribution Road in Section C.
2. Install new line posts at a maximum spacing of 10 feet.
3. Project area is asphalt-covered; drilling will be required for most post installations.

3.1.D Chain Link Fence Installation – Burial Lots

1. Install additional 6-foot chain link fencing at three burial lots, with linear footage to be field verified by the Contractor.
2. The burial lots' general locations and approximate measurements are as follows:
Lot 1: Makai of Palea Street, 560 linear feet
Lot 2: Between Makole Street and Wahakane Place (west boundary along Hoolulu Street), 1160 linear feet
Lot 3: Below Mahoe Street, 650 linear feet
**Exact fence alignment and extents shall be coordinated with DHHL and verified in the field.

3.1.E Gates

1. Install one double swing vehicle gate (12 feet per leaf; 24-foot opening total) along South Kohala Distribution Road at the location shown on the Project Map (Attachment A).
2. Install five pedestrian gates, one along South Kohala Distribution Road and four at the burial lots.
3. Gates shall:
 - Open freely with a maximum 3-inch gap when closed
 - Be supported by properly sized posts set to a minimum depth of 30 inches
 - Include appropriate hinges, hardware, and locking mechanisms (tongue and bell or equivalent), in accordance with Section 32 31 13 and Attachment B

3.3 Material Specifications

1. Fence framework, chain-link fabric, concrete foundations, and accessories shall conform to Section 32 31 13 – Chain Link Fences and Gates (attached as a reference specification) and the Standard Details for chain link fences and gates (Attachment B).
2. All materials shall be supplied by the Contractor and included in the bid price. The Contractor is responsible for procurement, delivery, storage, and security of all materials. DHHL is not liable for loss or damage.

3.4 UXO (Unexploded Ordnance) Training Requirement

1. The project area has been surveyed for unexploded ordnance (UXO). Prior to commencing any work on site, the Contractor shall ensure that all on-site supervisory personnel and field staff attend a short UXO awareness and safety training.
2. The Contractor shall coordinate with DHHL to schedule a UXO training session with Dave Griffin or his designee. Attendance at this training is mandatory for all Contractor personnel who will be working within the project area.
3. The Contractor shall comply with all instructions, safety procedures, and restrictions provided during the UXO training and any UXO-related addenda issued for this project.
4. No ground-disturbing work (including drilling for fence posts or excavation for gate posts) shall commence until UXO training has been completed.

3.5 Contractor Requirements

1. Contractor must possess a valid State of Hawaii "A" General Engineering or "C-32" Ornamental Guardrail license at the time of bid opening.
2. Contractor must comply with all State procurement requirements, including registration and compliance through Hawaii Compliance Express (HCE), as required by HRS Chapters 103D and 104, Wages and Hours of Employees on Public Works Law.
3. Work shall conform to all applicable Federal, State, and local regulations, including but not limited to safety, environmental, and UXO requirements.
4. Contractor must provide comparable-project documentation, references, and other qualifications upon request after low-bidder determination.

3.6 Schedule of Work

1. The Contractor shall complete all work within the project period specified in the Special Provisions.
2. Work hours and site access restrictions will be coordinated with the DHHL Land Agent.

4. SPECIAL PROVISIONS

4.1 Scope

Furnishing chain link fence and gate installation at the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) South Kohala Distribution Road property and three nearby burial site lots shall be in accordance with these Specifications, Special Provisions, and General Conditions, Form AG-008.

4.2 Contract Administrator

For this contract, the Contract Administrator is the DHHL Land Agent or designated representative.

4.3 Term of Contract

The contract term shall begin on November 1, 2026, and end on June 30, 2027, as specified in the HlePRO solicitation. The Contractor shall complete all work within sixty (60) calendar days after receipt of the Notice to Proceed. The sixty (60)-calendar-day performance period shall occur within the contract term. Any extension of the contract term or performance period shall be subject to DHHL approval and shall comply with HRS Chapter 103D.

4.4 Responsibilities of Offeror

Offeror is advised that if awarded a contract under this solicitation, Offeror shall, upon award of the contract, furnish proof of compliance with the requirements of Section 103D-310(c), HRS:

1. Chapter 237, tax clearance;
2. Chapter 383, unemployment insurance;
3. Chapter 386, workers' compensation;
4. Chapter 392, temporary disability insurance;
5. Chapter 393, pre-paid health care; and
6. Chapter 103D-310(c), Certificate of Good Standing (COGS) for entities doing business in the State.

The State will verify compliance on Hawaii Compliance Express (HCE).

4.5 Hawaii Compliance Express

The HCE is an electronic system used to quickly verify proof of compliance of vendors/contractors/service providers doing business in the State. The HCE certificate, *Certificate of Vendor Compliance* is a printable certificate that will provide *compliant* status in real time. It is an online certificate process of the tax clearance from the Department of Taxation and the Internal Revenue Service; a certificate of compliance from the Labor and Industrial Relations and a *Certificate of Good Standing* from the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs required pursuant to Section 103D-310(c), HRS and Section 3-122-112, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR).

Vendors/contractors/service providers are advised to register with HCE at <https://vendors.ehawaii.gov>. Vendors/contractors/service providers will pay an annual fee of \$12.00, or as amended, to the Hawaii Information Consortium, LLC (HIC).

4.6 Bidder Qualifications

In addition to meeting the legal and other requirements of this IFB, the bidder must meet the following bidder qualification requirements to be considered for award:

1. Bidder shall have a valid "A" General Engineering or "C-32" Ornamental Guardrail license registered with the State of Hawaii, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, and shall have been actively engaged in commercial, governmental, industrial, or related fencing/site-construction work for a minimum of five (5) years immediately preceding bid submission. The bidder, or its proposed fencing subcontractor, shall have successfully completed at least three (3) comparable fencing-and-gate projects within the past five (5) years, including at least one project with a contract value of \$100,000 or more or involving at least 2,000 linear feet of chain-link fence and related gates. The bidder shall furnish its license number on Offer Form page OF-1.
2. Bidder shall conduct business from a permanent office in the State of Hawaii and be accessible in person or by telephone during normal State business hours from 7:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. HST to address requests that require immediate attention.
3. Completion and submittal of Offer Form.
4. Bidder shall have at the time of bidding, a certificate of insurance in force as listed on the Offer Form page.

The Offeror, at no extra cost, shall provide additional background information and documentation on any of the above requirements if requested by the DHHL.

CERTIFICATION OF INDEPENDENT COST DETERMINATION

By submission of a bid in response to this IFB, the bidder certifies as follows:

1. The costs in this IFB have been arrived at independently, without consultation, communication, or agreement with any other bidder, as to any matter relating to such costs to restrict competition.
2. Unless otherwise required by law, the cost that has been quoted in this IFB has not been knowingly disclosed by the bidder before award, directly or indirectly, to any other bidder or competitor before the award of the contract.
3. No other attempt has been made or will be made by the bidder to indicate any other person or firm to submit or not to submit to restrict competition.

STANDARD QUALIFICATION QUESTIONNAIRE FOR OFFERORS

1. In compliance with HRS Section 103D-310, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder may be required to complete a standard questionnaire. When required, the completed questionnaire shall be submitted to the DHHL for evaluation.
2. If required the lowest responsive and responsible bidder shall submit answers to questions contained in the STANDARD QUALIFICATION QUESTIONNAIRE FOR OFFERORS (SPO Form-021), properly

executed and notarized, setting forth a complete statement of the experience of the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

3. If upon review of the Questionnaire, or otherwise, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder appears not fully qualified or able to perform the intended work, the Chairperson shall, after affording the Bidder an opportunity to be heard and if still of the opinion that the Bidder is not fully qualified to perform the work, provide a written determination of non-responsibility of an offeror.

4. Failure to complete and submit the prequalification questionnaire within the time allowed may be grounds for a determination of non-responsibility in accordance with HRS Section 103D and HAR Section 3-122-108.

4.7 Site Inspection

Before submittal of an offer, Offerors may inspect the location to thoroughly familiarize themselves with existing conditions, rules and regulations, UXO constraints, and the extent and nature of work to be performed. Offeror inspection is not mandatory; however, submission of an offer shall be evidence that the Offeror understands the scope of the project and shall comply with the Specifications herein, if awarded the contract.

4.8 Inquiries

All inquiries to this IFB shall be submitted via HlePRO in the Questions & Answers tab by the designated date and time. Only those inquiries received by the deadline shall be responded to via HlePRO. Any changes to the IFB will be made by an addendum. Offerors shall be responsible for checking the HlePRO solicitation for any subsequent addenda issued before submitting their offer.

4.9 Bid Preparation

Offer Form, Page OF-1 Bidder is requested to submit its offer using Bidder's exact legal name as registered with the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, if applicable; and to indicate the exact legal name in the appropriate space on Offer Form, page OF-1. Failure to do so may delay the proper execution of the contract.

Notice of Intention to Bid

1. In accordance with Section 103D-310, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and Section 3-122-108, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), a written Notice of Intention to Bid (hereinafter "Notice") must be submitted to the Chairman of the Hawaiian Homes Commission ("Chairman"), who is the Department's chief procurement officer. The Notice may be faxed, hand carried, mailed, or e-mailed to the office indicated in the Notice.

2. The written Notice must be received by DHHL no later than the date and time specified in the Notice to Bidders. The written Notice will be time stamped when received by DHHL. The time designated by the time stamping device in DHHL shall be official. If the written Notice is hand carried, then the bearer is responsible to ensure that the Notice is time stamped by DHHL. If the

Notice is delivered through facsimile (fax) machine, the time of receipt by DHHL's fax machine shall be official. If the Notice is sent by email, the time indicated in the date and time field of the email as received by DHHL shall be official.

3. It is the responsibility of the prospective Bidder to ensure that the written Notice is received in time and DHHL assumes no responsibility for failure of timely delivery caused by the prospective Bidder or by any method of conveyance chosen by the prospective Bidder. DHHL shall use best efforts to return a signed acknowledgement of receipt of Notice from Bidder(s).

4. If two (2) or more prospective Bidders desire to bid jointly as a joint venture on a single project, they must file an affidavit of joint venture with their Notice. Such affidavit of joint venture will be valid only for the specific project for which it is filed. No further license is required when all parties to the joint venture possess current and appropriate contractor's licenses. Joint ventures are required to be licensed in accordance with Chapter 444, HRS, as amended, and the rules and regulations of the Contractor's License Board when any party to the joint venture agreement does not hold a current or appropriate contractor's license. The joint venture must be registered with the office of the Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs in accordance with Chapter 425, HRS, as amended.

5. No persons, firm or corporation may bid where (1) the person, firm, or corporation, or (2) a corporation owned substantially by the person, firm, or corporation, or (3) a substantial stockholder or an officer of the corporation, or (4) a partner or substantial investor in the firm is in arrears in any payment owed to the State of Hawaii or any of its political subdivisions or is in default of any obligation to the State of Hawaii or to all or to any of its political subdivisions, including default as a surety or failure to perform faithfully and diligently any previous contract with DHHL.

Bid Security

1. Subject to the exceptions in Section 3-122-223(d), HAR, all lump sum bids of \$25,000 (twenty-five thousand dollars) and higher, or lump sum base bids including alternates of \$25,000 (twenty-five thousand dollars) and higher, that are not accompanied by bid security are non-responsive. Bid security shall be one of the following:

a. Surety bid bond underwritten by a company licensed to issue bonds in this State; or

b. Legal Tender; or

c. Certificate of Deposit; credit union share certificate; or cashier's, treasurer's, teller's or official check drawn by, or a certified check accepted by, and payable on demand to the State by a bank, a savings institution, or credit union insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or the National Credit Union Administration. Company or personal checks are not considered "official checks" and will not be accepted.

(i) These instruments may be utilized only to a maximum of \$100,000 (one hundred thousand dollars).

(ii) If the required security or bond amount totals over \$100,000 (one hundred thousand dollars), more than one instrument not exceeding \$100,000 (one hundred thousand dollars) each and issued by different financial institutions shall be accepted.

(iii) CAUTION - Bidders are cautioned that certificates of deposit or share certificates with an early withdrawal penalty must have a face value sufficient to

cover the maximum penalty amount in addition to the proposal guaranty requirement. If the certificate is made out to two names, the certificate must be assigned unconditionally to the DHHL.

2. Unless otherwise stated, the bid security shall be in an amount equal to at least five percent (5%) of the lump sum bid or lump sum base bid including all additive alternates or in an amount required by the terms of the federal funding, where applicable.
3. If the Bidder is a corporation, evidence in the form of a corporate resolution, authorizing the corporate representative to execute the bond must be submitted with the proposal. (See sample in Appendix.) If the Bidder is a partnership, all partners must sign the bond or evidence in the form of a partnership agreement must be submitted showing the authority of the partner.
4. If the Bidder is a joint-venture, all parties to the joint-venture must sign the bond; provided, that one party to the joint-venture may sign on behalf of the joint-venture if evidence in the form of a joint-venture agreement or power of attorney, is submitted showing the authority of the signatory to sign the bond on behalf of the joint-venture.
5. In the case where the award will be made on a group or item basis, the amount of bid security shall be based on the total bid for all groups or items submitted.
6. Bidders are cautioned that surety bid bonds which place a limit in value to the difference between the bid amount and the next acceptable bid, such value not to exceed the purported amount of the bond, are not acceptable. Also, surety bid bonds which place a time limit on the right of the State to make claim other than allowed by statutes or the GENERAL CONDITIONS are not acceptable. Bidders are hereby notified that a surety bid bond containing such limitation(s) is not acceptable and a bid accompanied by such surety bid bond will be automatically rejected.

SUBMITTAL OF BID SECURITY

Bid securities shall be scanned and uploaded with offer to HlePRO. The four (4) lowest Bidders shall mail in their bid security, following the opening and checking of the proposals. The retained bid securities of the four lowest Bidders will be returned within five (5) working days following the complete execution of the contract.

Bid Quotation Unit bid price shall include labor, equipment, installation, transportation, storage, training, all applicable taxes, and any other costs incurred to provide the product or services specified.

Tax Liability Work to be performed under this solicitation is a business activity taxable under Chapter 237, HRS, and vendors are advised that they are liable for the Hawaii General Excise Tax (GET) at the current rate for each county. If, however, an Offeror is a person exempt by the HRS from paying the GET and therefore not liable for the taxes on this solicitation, the Offeror shall state its tax-exempt status and cite the HRS chapter or section allowing the exemption.

Taxpayer Preference For evaluation purposes, pursuant to Section 103D-1008, HRS, the bidder's tax-exempt price offer submitted in response to an IFB shall be increased by the applicable retail rate of general excise tax and the applicable use tax. Under no circumstance shall the dollar amount of

the award include the aforementioned adjustment.

Insurance Bidder shall provide the insurance information requested on the Offer Form and maintain the insurance coverage required by Section 4.17.

4.10 Requirements of Chapter 104, HRS – Wages and Hours of Employees on Public Works Law

Chapter 104 applies to every contract exceeding \$2,000 for the construction of a public works project. Contractor shall pay its laborers and mechanics not less than the prevailing wages promulgated by the State of Hawaii, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.

Wage Requirements:

- Pay prevailing wages (hourly rate + fringe benefits) as determined by DLIR.
- Provide weekly certified payrolls; contractor ensures submission of all subcontractors payrolls.
- Offer overtime at 1.5 times the basic hourly rate (plus fringes) for work beyond 8 hours/day or on weekends/holidays, or follow collective bargaining agreement rates.
- Post wage rate schedules prominently at the job site and distribute copies to laborers/mechanics.

Non-Compliance:

If Contractor or subcontractor:

- Fails to pay required wages,
- Does not submit timely or accurate payroll certifications, or
- Refuses to comply with Chapter 104's requirements –

...the *Contracting Agency* may, per HRS Section 104-4 and Section 104-21, suspend pay, terminate the contract (in whole or part), and hold the Contractor and sureties liable for any resulting excess costs.

4.11 Award of Contract

Method of Award Award, if made, shall be to the responsive, responsible Bidder submitting the lowest Total Bid Price submitted on Offer Form (OF-1).

HRS Chapter 237 tax clearance requirement for award Instructions are as follows:

Tax Clearance and Compliance Requirements for Award. The lowest responsive Offeror shall be required to submit proof of tax clearance, certificate of compliance from DLIR, and Certificate of Good Standing (COGS) as required by HRS and HAR.

Tax Clearance and Compliance Requirements for Award. The lowest responsive Offeror shall be required to submit proof of tax clearance, certificate of compliance from DLIR, and Certificate of Good Standing (COGS) as required by HRS and HAR.

Compliance with Section 103D-310(c), HRS, for an entity doing business in the State The lowest responsive Offeror shall be required to submit a *CERTIFICATE OF GOOD STANDING* (Certificate) issued by the State of Hawaii Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs Business Registration Division (BREG). The Certificate is valid for six months from the date of issue and must be valid on the date it is received by DHHL. A photocopy of the certificate is

acceptable to DHHL.

To obtain the Certificate, the Offeror must first be registered with the BREG. A sole proprietorship, however, is not required to register with the BREG, and therefore not required to submit the certificate.

Online business registration and the Certificate are available at <https://cca.hawaii.gov/breg/>. To register or to obtain the Certificate by phone, call (808) 586-2727 (M-F 7:45 to 4:30 HST). Offerors are advised that there are costs associated with registering and obtaining the Certificate.

Final Payment Requirements The contractor is required to submit a tax clearance certificate for final payment on the contract. A tax clearance certificate, not over two months old, with an original green certified copy stamp, must accompany the invoice for final payment on the contract.

In addition to the tax clearance certificate, an original “Certification of Compliance for Final Payment” (SPO Form-22), will be required for final payment. A copy of the Form is available at www.spo.hawaii.gov. Select “Forms for Vendors/Contractors” from the Procurement of Goods, Services, & Construction - Chapter 103D, HRS, menu.

Hawaii Compliance Express Alternately, instead of separately applying for these certificates at various state agencies, vendors may choose to use the Hawaii Compliance Express (HCE), which allows businesses to register online through a simple wizard interface at <http://vendors.chawaii.gov> to acquire a “Certificate of Vendor Compliance.” The HCE provides the current compliance status as of the issuance date. The “Certificate of Vendor Compliance” indicating that the vendor’s status is compliant with the requirements of §103D-310(c), HRS, shall be accepted for contracting and final payment purposes. Vendors that elect to use the new HCE services will be required to pay an annual fee of \$12.00 to the Hawaii Information Consortium, LLC (HIC). Vendors choosing not to participate in the HCE program will be required to provide the paper certificates as instructed in the sections previous to this one.

Timely Submission of all Certificates The above certificates should be applied for and submitted to DHHL as soon as possible. If the valid certificates are not submitted on a timely basis, an offer otherwise responsive and responsible may not receive the award.

4.12 Campaign Contributions by State and County Contractor

It has been determined that funds for this contract have been appropriated by a legislative body.

Therefore, the Offeror, if awarded a contract in response to this solicitation, agrees to comply with Section 11-355, HRS, which states that campaign contributions are prohibited from a State and county government contractor during the term of the contract if the contractor is paid with funds appropriated by a legislative body.

4.13 Protest

According to HRS Section 103D-701, a protest of the solicitation must be made before bid opening, and a protest of an award or proposed award shall be submitted within five (5) working days after the posting of the award of the contract. The notice of award resulting from this solicitation shall be posted online.

A protest shall be submitted in writing within five (5) working days after the posting of the award as

listed below; provided that a protest based upon the content of the solicitation shall be submitted in writing before the date set for receipt of offers.

Any protest according to HRS Section 103D-701, and HAR Section 3-126-3, shall be submitted in writing to DHHL's Procurement Officer at the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, 91-5420 Kapolei Parkway, Kapolei, HI 96707.

4.14 Acceptance of Offer

Acceptance of the offer, if any, will be made within thirty (30) calendar days after bid opening, and the prices quoted by the Offeror shall remain firm for the thirty (30) day period.

4.15 Contract Execution

The State shall forward a formal contract to the successful bidder for execution. The contract shall be signed by the successful bidder and returned within ten (10) days after receipt by the bidder. Upon execution of the contract, DHHL will issue a fully executed copy to the Contractor. No work will be undertaken by the Contractor before receiving the Notice to Proceed. Performance or payment bonds are required.

4.16 Notice to Proceed

Work will commence on the official commencement date specified on the Notice to Proceed. No work is to be undertaken by the Contractor before the commencement date specified on the Notice to Proceed issued by the State upon execution of the contract by both parties. The State of Hawaii is not liable for any work, contract, costs, expenses, loss of profits, or any damages whatsoever incurred by the Contractor before the official commencement date.

4.17 Liability Insurance

The required liability insurance shall be maintained in full force and effect during the life of this contract, liability and property damage insurance to protect the Contractor and the subcontractors, if any, from claims for damages for personal injury, accidental death, and property damage that may arise from operations under this contract, whether such operations be by the Contractor or by a subcontractor or anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them. If any subcontractor is involved in the performance of the contract, the insurance policy or policies shall name the subcontractor as additional insured.

As an alternative to the Contractor providing insurance to cover operations performed by a subcontractor and naming the subcontractor as additional insured, the Contractor may require the subcontractor to provide its insurance that meets the requirements herein. It is understood that a subcontractor's insurance policy or policies are in addition to the Contractor's liability insurance policy or policies.

The following minimum insurance coverage(s) and limit(s) shall be provided by the Contractor, including its subcontractor(s) where appropriate.

Each insurance policy required by this contract, including a subcontractor's policy, shall contain the following clauses:

1. "This insurance shall not be canceled, limited in the scope of coverage, or non-renewed until after 30 days written notice has been given to the State of Hawaii, Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, 91-5420 Kapolei Parkway, Kapolei, HI 96707"
2. "The State of Hawaii is added as an additional insured with respect to operations performed for the State of Hawaii."
3. "It is agreed that any insurance maintained by the State of Hawaii will apply in excess of, and not contribute with, insurance provided by this policy."

The minimum insurance required shall be in full compliance with the Hawaii Insurance Code throughout the entire term of the contract, including supplemental agreements.

Upon the Contractor's execution of the contract, the Contractor agrees to deposit with the State of Hawaii certificate(s) of insurance necessary to satisfy the State that the insurance provisions of this contract have been complied with and to keep such insurance in effect and the certificate(s) therefore on deposit with the State during the entire term of this contract, including those of its subcontractor(s), where appropriate. Upon request by the State, the Contractor shall be responsible for furnishing a copy of the policy or policies.

Failure of the Contractor to provide and keep in force such insurance shall be regarded as material default under this contract, entitling the State to exercise any or all of the remedies provided in this contract for a default of the Contractor.

The procuring of such required insurance shall not be construed to limit the Contractor's liability hereunder nor to fulfill the indemnification provisions and requirements of this contract.

Notwithstanding said policy or policies of insurance, the Contractor shall be obliged for the full and total amount of any damage, injury, or loss caused by negligence or neglect connected with this contract.

Liquidated damages are fixed at the sum of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) per calendar day of delay the Contractor fails to achieve final completion by the contract completion date or fails to perform in whole or in part any of his obligations specified herein. Liquidated damages, if assessed, may be deducted from any payments due or to become due to the Contractor.

4.21 State's General Conditions

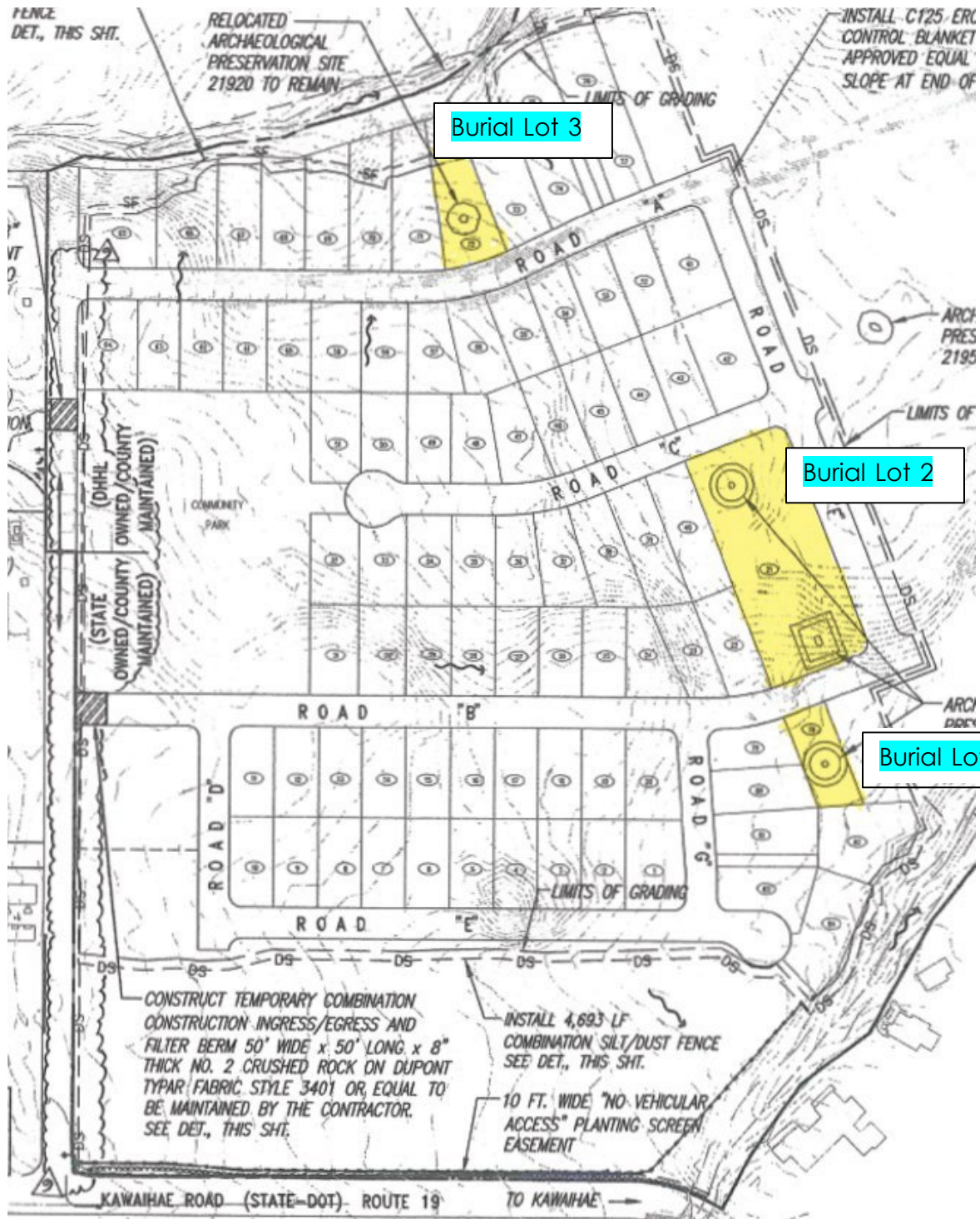
Nothing in the Special Provisions shall supersede the General Conditions attached hereto. The Special Provisions shall serve to supplement the General Conditions.

4.22 Approvals

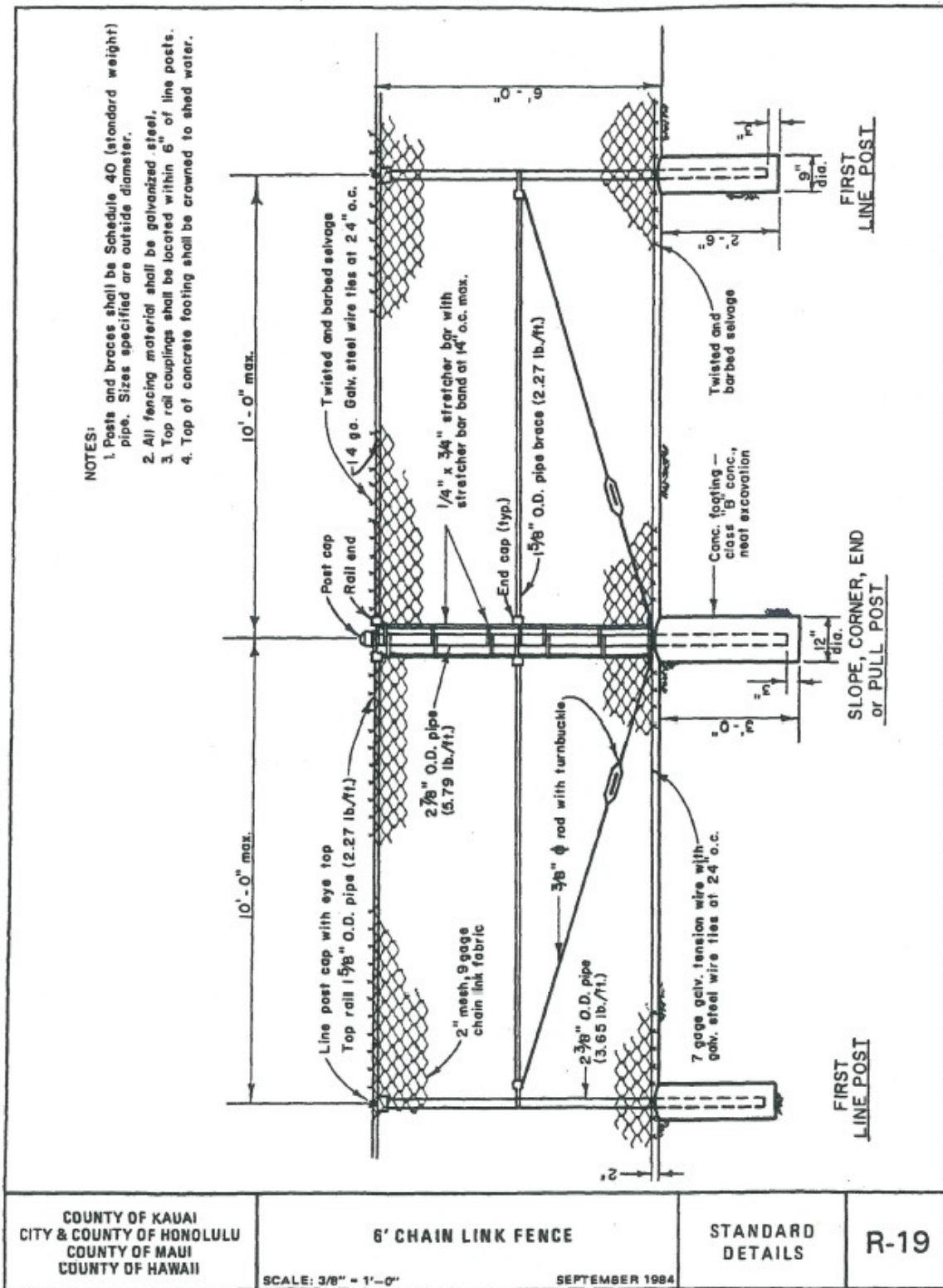

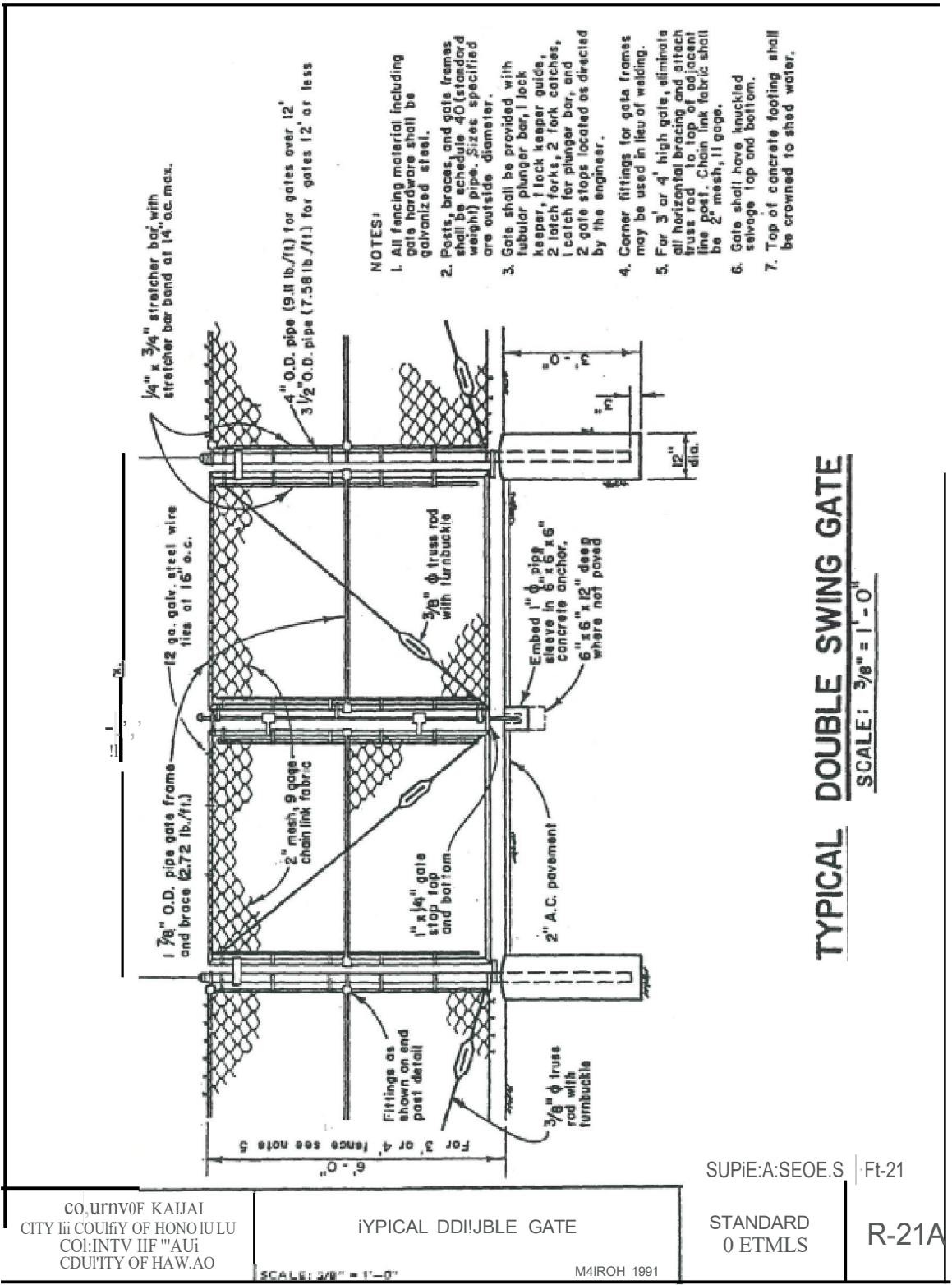
Attachment A - Project Map and Alignment

1. All fencing material including gate hardware shall be galvanized steel.
 2. Posts, braces, and gate frames shall be schedule 40 (standard weight) pipe. Sizes specified are outside diameter.
 3. Gate shall be provided with tubular plunger bar, 1 lock keeper, 1 lock keeper guide, 2 latch forks, 2 lock catches, 1 catch for plunger bar, and 2 gate stops located as directed by the engineer.
 4. Corner fittings for gate frames may be used in lieu of welding.
 5. For 3' or 4' high gate, eliminate all horizontal bracing and attach truss rod to top of adjacent line post. Chain link fabric shall be 2" mesh, 11 gage.
 6. Gate shall have knuckled selvage top and bottom.
 7. Top of concrete footing shall be crowned to shed water.

Background

The 160 square mile Former Waikoloa Maneuver Area (FWMA) is in South Kohala on the Island of Hawaii. FWMA includes Ouli, Waikoloa Village, and Waimea.

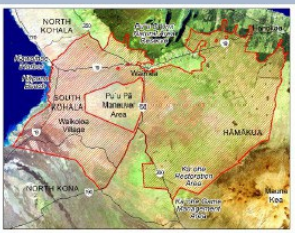
The Navy established FWMA on Parker Ranch in 1943 through an agreement with Parker Ranch. Training included artillery firing with live ammunition and troop maneuvers. In 1946, the land was returned to Parker Ranch. Although several munitions removal actions have been conducted, munitions including artillery shells, fuzes, mines, rockets, grenades and mortars are still present. Although these munitions have been in the environment for nearly 70 years, they remain dangerous. Some munitions become more sensitive with age and can detonate with the slightest touch.

The US Army Corps of Engineers is removing munitions from areas easily accessible to the public, but this will take many years to complete. Even though munitions are rarely encountered, people living and playing near the FWMA should be aware of the potential hazard munitions pose. As such, being wary of any of old metal objects they come across in the area.

Help protect yourself, your family, and community from the potential explosive hazards present by learning and following the 3Rs of Explosive Safety (Recognize, Retreat, Report).

Recognize

Recognize when you may have encountered a munition and that munitions are dangerous.

Recognizing when you may have encountered a munition and that munitions are dangerous are the most important steps in reducing the risk of injury or death. Munitions may be encountered on land or in the water. They may be easy or hard to identify.

To avoid the risk of injury or death, follow the 3Rs of explosives safety and remember:

- Munitions may be encountered on land or in the water. They may be easy or hard to identify.
- Be aware that munitions are dangerous and they do not become safer with age
- Do not be tempted to take or keep a munition as a souvenir.

Munitions come in many sizes, shapes and colors. Some may look like bullets or bombs while others look like pipes, small cans or even a car muffler. Whether whole or in parts, new or old, shiny or rusty, munitions can still explode. The easiest way to avoid injury or death is to stay out of areas marked with warning signs or charted as restricted.




Retreat

Do not approach, touch, move or disturb it, but carefully leave the area.

When you encounter or think you have encountered a munition, avoid death or injury by retreating from the area.

If you encounter or suspect you have encountered a munition:

- Do not approach, touch, move or disturb it.
- Immediately and carefully leave the area; retrace your steps out of the area by the same path which you entered.

Once safely away from the munition, mark the path (e.g., with a piece of clothing) so response personnel can find the munition.





Report

Immediately notify the police if on land, or the U.S. Coast Guard, if on navigable waters.

Protect yourself, your family, your friends and your community by immediately reporting munitions or suspected munitions to the police.

Help us by providing as much information as you can remember about what you saw and where you saw it. This will help the police and military or civilian explosive ordnance disposal personnel find, evaluate and address the situation.

If you believe you may have encountered a munition, call 911 and report:

- The area where you encountered it.
- Its general description. Remember, do not approach touch, move or disturb it.
- When possible, provide:
 - Its estimated size
 - Its shape
 - Any visible markings, including coloring

3. Diver (Diving Other Than Aqua Lung):

4. Electrician (Inside, Outside):
 - A. One and one-half times the straight-time rate while working in a tunnel under construction; under water with aqualung equipment; in a completed tunnel which has only one entrance or exit providing access to safety and where no other personnel are working; or in an underground structure having no access to safety or where no other personnel are working.
 - B. Double the straight-time rate shall be paid for the following types of hazardous work regardless if fall prevention devices are used:
 - 1) While working from poles, trusses, stacks, towers, tanks, bosun's chairs, swinging or rolling scaffolds, supporting structures, and open platforms, over 70 feet from the ground where the employee is subject to a free fall; provided, however, that when work is performed on stacks, towers or permanent platforms where the employees are on a firm footing within an enclosure, a hazardous condition does not exist regardless of height;
 - 2) While working outside of a railing or enclosure, or temporary platforms extending outside of a building, or from scaffolding or ladder within an enclosure where an employee's footing is within one foot of the top of such railing, and the employee is subject to a free fall of over 70 feet;
 - 3) Working on buildings while leaning over the railing or edge of the building, and is subject to a free fall of 70 feet; or
 - 4) Two hours minimum hazardous pay per day shall be paid while climbing to a stack, tower or permanent platform which exceeds 70 feet from the ground but where the employee is on a firm footing within an enclosure.
 - C. Five percent per hour shall be added to the hourly wage for height pay while working above 9,000 feet elevation.

REMARKS:

5. Equipment Operator:

- A. Operators and Assistants to Engineer (climbing a boom) of cranes (under 50 tons) with booms of eighty feet or more (including jib) or of cranes (under 50 tons) with leads of one hundred feet or more, shall receive additional premium according to the following schedule:

- C. In a raise or shaft, a premium of \$.40 per hour will be paid in addition to the regular straight time wage.
 A raise is defined to be an underground excavation (lined or unlined) whose length exceeds its width and the inclination of the grade from the excavation is greater than 20 degrees from the horizontal.
 A shaft is defined to be an excavation (lined or unlined) made from the surface of the earth, generally vertical in nature, but may decline up to 75 degrees from the vertical, and whose depth is greater than 15 feet and its largest horizontal dimension. Includes an underground silo.
- D. In a tunnel, a premium of \$.30 per hour will be paid in addition to the regular straight time wages.
 A tunnel is defined to be an underground excavation (lined or unlined) whose length exceeds its width and the inclination of the grade from the excavation is no greater than 20 degrees from the horizontal.

6. Glazier:

- A. \$1.00 per hour shall be added to the hourly rate for height pay for performing work which requires protection from fall hazards by guardrail systems, safety net systems, personal fall arrest systems, position devise systems, fall restraint systems, perimeter safety cables or controlled decking zones or during the use of Swing Stages, Scissor lifts, Man lifts, Boom Lifts.
- B. \$4.00 per hour shall be added to the hourly rate for night work for performing work between 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. For the purposes of computing overtime, the night work premium shall be treated as part of the employee's regular straight time rate.

7. Heat and Frost Insulator: Six percent per hour shall be added to the hourly wage for hazardous pay while working from a boatswain chair, staging or free standing scaffolding erected from the ground up or mezzanine floor subject to a free fall and skyclimber suspended from a permanent structure and when working above 40 feet.

8. Iron Worker:

- A. \$1.00 per hour shall be added to the hourly wage while working in tunnels or coffer dams.
 \$2.00 per hour shall be added to the hourly wage while working under or covered with water (submerged), or on the summits of Mauna Kea, Mauna Loa or Haleakala.
- B. Certified Welder's, while welding only, shall receive \$3.00 above journeyman pay effective 9/1/2024.

9. Plumber: One and one-half times the straight-time rate for height pay while working from OSHA approved trusses, stacks, towers, tanks, bosun's chair, swinging or rolling scaffolding, supporting structures or on open platforms where the employee is subject to a direct fall of 40 feet or more. Provided, however, that when said work is performed where the employee is on a firm footing within an enclosure, a hazardous condition does not exist regardless of height. \$1.00 per hour shall be added to the straight-time rate while working with flame cutting or any type of welding equipment on any galvanized material or product for at least an hour.

1. Carpenter; Drywall & Acoustical Worker; Laborer: \$0.50 per hour shall be added to the regular straight-time rate for height pay for each hour while working from a bosun's chair and/or from a cable-suspended scaffold or work platform which is free swinging (not attached to building) for each hour worked on said rig.
2. Cement Finisher; Mason (Bricklayer); Plasterer; Tile Marble and Terrazzo Worker: \$1.00 per hour shall be added to the regular straight-time rate for height pay for each hour while working from a bosun's chair and/or from a cable-suspended scaffold or work platform which is free swinging (not attached to building) for each hour worked on said rig.
3. Equipment Operator: \$1.25 per hour shall be added to the hourly wage while operating a rig suspended by ropes or cables or to perform work on a Yo-Yo Cat.
4. Electrician (Wireman & Lineman):
 - A. One and one-half times the straight-time rate while working in a tunnel under construction; under water with aqualung equipment; in a completed tunnel which has only one entrance or exit providing access to safety and where no other personnel are working; or in an underground structure having no access to safety or where no other personnel are working.
 - B. Double the straight-time rate shall be paid for the following types of hazardous work regardless if fall prevention devices are used:
 - 1) While working from poles, trusses, stacks, towers, tanks, bosun's chairs, swinging or rolling scaffolds, supporting structures, and open platforms, over 70 feet from the ground where the employee is subject to a free fall; provided, however, that when work is performed on stacks, towers or permanent platforms where the employees are on a firm footing within an enclosure, a hazardous condition does not exist regardless of height;
 - 2) While working outside of a railing or enclosure, or temporary platforms extending outside of a building, or from scaffolding or ladder within an enclosure where an employee's footing is within one foot of the top of such railing, and the employee is subject to a free fall of over 70 feet;
 - 3) Working on buildings while leaning over the railing or edge of the building, and is subject to a free fall of 70 feet; or
 - 4) Two hours minimum hazardous pay per day shall be paid while climbing to a stack, tower or permanent platform which exceeds 70 feet from the ground but where the employee is on a firm footing within an enclosure.
 - C. Five percent per hour shall be added to the hourly wage for height pay while working above 9,000 feet elevation.
5. Glazier:
 - A. \$1.00 per hour shall be added to the hourly rate for height pay for performing work which requires protection from fall hazards by guardrail systems, safety net systems, personal fall arrest systems, position devise systems, fall restraint systems, perimeter safety cables or controlled decking zones or during the use of Swing Stages, Scissor lifts, Man lifts, Boom Lifts.
 - B. \$4.00 per hour shall be added to the hourly rate for night work for performing work between 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. For the purposes of computing overtime, the night work premium shall be treated as part of the employee's regular straight time rate.
6. Heat and Frost Insulator: Six percent per hour shall be added to the hourly wage for hazardous pay while working from a boatswain chair, staging or free standing scaffolding erected from ground up or mezzanine floor subject to a free fall and skyclimber suspended from a permanent structure and when working above 40 feet.
7. Iron Worker: \$1.00 per hour shall be added to the hourly wage while working in tunnels or coffer dams. \$2.00 per hour shall be added to the hourly wage while working under or covered with water (submerged), or on the summits of Mauna Kea, Mauna Loa or Haleakala.
8. Plumber: One and one-half times the straight-time rate for height pay while working from OSHA approved trusses, stacks, towers, tanks, bosun's chair, swinging or rolling scaffolding, supporting structures or on open platforms where the employee is subject to a direct fall of 40 feet or more. Provided, however, that when said work is performed where the employee is on a firm footing within an enclosure, a hazardous condition does not exist regardless of height. \$1.00 per hour shall be added to the straight-time rate while working with flame cutting or any type of welding equipment on any galvanized material or product for at least an hour.

REMARKS:

9. Roofer: When an apprentice has accumulated 2,500 hours, \$4.35 will be added to his/her pension/annuity plan. The apprenticeship program for apprentices indentured on or after November 4, 2012, consists of four steps with 2,000 hours for each step.
10. Overtime/Holiday must be paid at one and one-half times the basic hourly rate, plus the hourly cost of required fringe, including legal holidays of the State (<https://dhrd.hawaii.gov/state-observed-holidays/>), with the following exceptions:
 - A. Two times the basic hourly rate, plus the hourly cost of required fringe.

The condition of this obligation is such that, if Contractor shall promptly and faithfully perform the Contract in accordance with, in all respects, the stipulations, agreements, covenants and conditions of the Contract as it now exists or may be modified according to its terms, and shall deliver the Project to the Obligea, or to its successors or assigns, fully completed as in the Contract specified and free from all liens and claims and without further cost, expense or charge to the Obligea, its officers, agents, successors or assigns, free and harmless from all suits or actions of every nature and kind which may be brought for or on account of any injury or damage, direct or indirect, arising or growing out of the doing of said work or the repair or maintenance thereof or the manner of doing the same or the neglect of the Contractor or its agents or servants or the improper performance of the Contract by the Contractor or its agents or servants or from any other cause, then this obligation shall be void; otherwise it shall be and remain in full force and effect.

AND IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED that suit on this bond may be brought before a court of competent jurisdiction without a jury, and that the sum or sums specified in the said Contract as liquidated damages, if any, shall be forfeited to the Obligea, its successors or assigns, in the event of a breach of any, or all, or any part of, the covenants, agreements, conditions, or stipulations contained in the Contract or in this bond in accordance with the terms thereof.

The amount of this bond may be reduced by and to the extent of any payment or payments made in good faith hereunder.
