## Addendum 2

This addendum provides answers to responses sent by the March 23, 2020 deadline for inquiry.

1. Does the contractor have to supply his own equipment to load materials from DLNR base yard?

The base yard is equipped with a forklift, so the contractor does not need to provide a forklift to load materials. Due to rules however, coordination with contract administration is necessary when collecting materials, as only authorized personnel may use the fork lift.

2. Where is the staging area for flying the materials to the fence site?

The NASA facility is the most convenient and safe place. The contractor will have to apply for authorization to use the facility through NASA. This packet can be emailed to the winning contractor. In the event that NASA is not available, there is an additional unimproved DOFAW landing zone on Makaha ridge.

3. Will the contractor have to shift materials from the staging area in the advent there is a stand down?

Given the current circumstances, that may be a possibility but DOFAW will work with the contractor to assist as much as is possible, in the event that materials may have to be abandoned temporarily. Contractors have used alternative staging areas in the past and this may be an option that the contractor will want to consider.

4. Can vehicles be left at the staging area when the crew are on site?

In the past vehicles have been allowed to remain at the staging area when installation crews are remotely situated. It is highly recommended that the contractor limit the amount of vehicles to be left at the staging area, due to the fact that this is a shared space. All vehicles should be conveniently parked away from staging area and in such a way that does not obstruct other vehicles or workers in that area. If the staging area is at Makaha ridge then the State cannot guarantee the safety of those vehicles. Contractors may opt to use alternative staging areas.

5. Is the staging area a secure site?

NASA is a secure site, Makaha ridge is not a secure site. Contractors may wish to explore other more secure sites to stage.

6. If the fence is damaged in anyway by persons using the fence as a support, ladder, etc, who responsible for the repair?

If the fence is damaged by contractors then its obligatory for contractors to repair. If the fence is damaged by others then the State will have to address the issue, coordination between the contractor and the project administrator is key in identifying gates, once a gate is installed contractor may have to assist with signage installation on the fence that directs users to the gate.

7. If there is a conflict, will DLNR assign a staff member to monitor the site?
