SECTION 10 - FURNISHING OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC CONTROL AND SAFETY MEASURES AT
VARIOUS LOCATIONS

10.1 DESCRIPTION The work shall consist of furnishing all labor, necessary traffic control signs, devices, personnel (flagger) and equipment, including support vehicles, to provide traffic control and safety measures, as requested, which may be emergency in nature, on an indefinite quantity/“as needed” basis at various locations on the Island of Hawaii. **The Contractor shall set up and break down all traffic control devices and/or equipment, including temporary construction signs, traffic cones, message boards, and arrow boards.**

The State Highways Division ~~shall~~ **may** furnish, set up, maintain and take down all roadway work zone traffic control warning signs, cones and other devices needed for the section of the road to be manned by the Contractor **as needed**.

The Contractor is responsible in providing the specified services, 24-hours a day, 7-days a week when and as directed by the respective District Engineer, Maintenance Engineer, Maintenance Superintendent, or their designated representatives. Refer to Section 1.39 of the Special Provisions for the definition of “Engineer” and Section 10.4 (A) Hours of Operation, of the Specifications for more information.

The State reserves the right to use alternate sources of labor for traffic control, including its own forces or County of Hawaii Police Officers, as it may deem necessary. The State Highways Division shall coordinate with the Hawaii Police Department if the State requires uniformed Special Duty police officers to perform the required services.

All traffic control shall be done in conformance with the latest revisions of the following:

- Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) standards;
- Hawaii Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction;
- Standard Plans;
- Hawaii Administrative Rules, Title 19, Subtitle 5, Chapter 128 (HAR §19-128), Design, Placement, and Maintenance of Traffic Control Devices, HAR §19-129, Use of Traffic Control Devices at Work Sites on or Adjacent to Public Streets and Highways; and
- any other applicable Federal, State and local rules and regulations, as amended, revised or updated.

10.2 CONTRACTOR’S QUALIFICATIONS – Contractors will be asked to provide documentation of certificates and other requirements listed in the subsections below. Requested qualification documents shall be submitted to the State within seven working (7) days of the request. Failure to do so may result in rejection of bid by the Department of Transportation.

- A. The Contractor, including its traffic control staff, shall have the required nationally recognized Work Zone Traffic Control Safety – Flagger or Work Zone Safety Inspection training and certification that meets or exceeds the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) standards. The State shall require the successful bidder to submit current and valid certifications for verification prior to the contract award or at any time during the contract. Certifications shall be completed within a maximum of 4 years, or as required by the certification agency.

1. Bids shall include all Federal, State, County and all other applicable taxes
2. The TOTAL AMOUNT FOR COMPARISON OF BIDS for each group will be used to determine the lowest responsible bidder.
3. Bidders must complete all unit prices and amounts within a Group. Failure to do so may be grounds for rejection of bid for the applicable Group.
4. In case of a discrepancy between unit price and the total in said bid, the unit price shall prevail.
5. Bidder may bid on any or all groups. To be considered, bidder must submit a bid for all items within a group. Separate contracts will be awarded for each area. If a bidder is determined the lowest bidder for multiple areas, one combined contract will be awarded.
6. **Failure by the bidder to submit.** The bidder may be considered non-compliant with the requirements of the Specifications if the bidder fails to submit the specified documents no later than **seven (7) working days** from the date of request (date of receipt of the written request) from the State. This failure may result in a rejection of bid by the Department of Transportation.
7. Bidder shall make no changes to the items in the Proposal Schedule. Do not add or remove anything on the Proposal Schedule. Altered Proposal Schedules will be rejected. Only provide bid prices and totals where space is provided.
8. The Contract shall be an indefinite quantity/ "as needed" contract. Refer to Section 4.6 of the Special Provisions.

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NOTES: (cont'd)

9. The number of estimated maximum yearly quantities in this Proposal Schedule is for bidding purposes only. Payments to the Contractor will be made on the basis of actual number of service/deliveries and the unit bid price.
10. Prior to commencing with the work, the successful Bidder is required to submit a Certificate of Insurance. Refer to Section 7. Insurance, of the Specifications for more information
11. By submitting a proposal, the Bidder acknowledges he has read and understands all the provisions of the Special Provisions and the Specifications and is fully aware of all the conditions to be encountered in performing the work.
12. Completed Proposal file shall be uploaded into HiePRO prior to the bid opening date and time. All other required confidential or proprietary documents shall be uploaded separately, with “confidential” or similar notation, somewhere in the file name.

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ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS SUBMITTED VIA HIEPRO

1. What is the current hourly rate?

Response: The current hourly rate for comparable State positions can be found in Section 2.9 of the Special Provisions. Bidders are also encouraged to read through Section 7.8 of the Special Provisions for important wage rate information.

2. Is the contractor responsible for providing traffic cones and temporary road work signs for daily operations for each base yard??

Response: Yes. See Section 10.13 Basis of Payment

3. 1) Do you need truck mounted attenuator with arrow board & truck?

Response: No

- 2) Do you need Special Duty Police Officer?

Response: No

- 3) How many crew(s) do you need on each side? (one-man or two-men crew?)

Response: These are the suggested number of crews, at minimum for the following locations:

Hilo: 7 crews (2 man crew)

Ka'u: 1 crew (2 man crew)

South Kona: 2 crews (2 man crew)

North Kona: 1 crew (2 man crew)

Waimea: 2 crews (2 man crew)

Honoka'a: 1 crew (2 man crew)

Contraflow: 1 crew (6 man crew)

The suggested number of crews could change depending on the State's needs.

- 4) For the extension escalation clause, what is the maximum percentage & what is the basis of escalation?

Response: There is no maximum percentage, as the escalation is based on the changes in the prevailing wage rates for State civil service workers. See Section 10.12 Escalation Clause
